

This coming September I will celebrate forty one wonderful years as a member of The Breakers community. My unit 56 was completed in the second phase of the master plan.

I am a senior vice president with Gulf Guaranty Life Insurance and will commemorate my forty forth year with the organization in December. During that time I have served as president of the Jackson Touchdown Club and Chairman of the Mississippi Sports Hall of Fame. My military experience has been with the 114th Field Artillery, Mississippi Army National Guard, 31th "Dixie" Division. When the Mississippi State Guard was reactivated, I served in this major command of the Mississippi Military Department for twenty three years. From 2010 until 2013 I was the commanding general of the State Guard retiring in April 2013 as a major general in the Mississippi National Guard. In 2013 I was the recipient of the G.V. "Sonny" Montgomery Foundation Medal for Outstanding Leadership Performance.

In 1983 I began to travel internationally reaching five continents. Inspired by Father's curiosity and love of learning, I acquired a keen interest in military history. Through the past several decades I have visited most of the major battlefields of the American Civil War along with a number of Revolutionary War sites. In 1989 I joined a tour led by the eminent World War II historian and author Stephen Ambrose who encouraged me to initiate my own tour endeavor after he retired as a field guide. In the past twenty two years I have lead several tours that follow the American armed forces from the beaches of Normandy to the Rhine River. I never tire of going to Europe and sharing the stories of Allied victory on the continent.

In 2016 I threw my hat in the ring to run for alderman in the City of Ridgeland. By the good graces of the voters of Ward 5, I won the race by six votes. My close friends dubbed me "Landslide Lee". My time in office for the past four plus years has been rewarding and most interesting.
